

A very warm welcome to our 9.30am Holy Communion and 10.30am All-Age Service and if you are reading this we are glad you have found your way to the school.



At St Luke's Church we are rebuilding the West End of the church, but don't worry, the church will still observe Sunday services and all of its weekly activities. Here is a breakdown of where everything will be taking place at the school.



Next week we welcome Nigel Barnard our guest preacher from Perth in Australia. Nigel is pastor of a Pentecostal church in one of the most beautiful cities in the world and we loved having him when he visited us before in 2017.

- Normal Sunday Service including communion and all age worship will meet at St Luke's Primary School, Beeston Hill at 10.30.
- Early Kids Praise, a service aimed specifically at under 5's will run the first Sunday of every month at St Luke's School at 9am.
- Early morning communion will take place at St Luke's School at 9.30am the second and fourth Sunday of each month.
- Beavers will meet at St Luke's School at 5pm on Monday's with cubs and Scouts following them at 7pm.
- The Tuesday children's group Tots Tea and Toast will move to the United Free Church on the corner of Malvern Road near the Family Shopper and will meet at 9.30am as usual.
- The ESOL family project will meet at the United Free, Thursday after school during term times.



While the work is ongoing there will still be support available from the staff at St Luke's Church, do not hesitate to contact them through the Facebook page or using the details below. The building work is set to extend the West side of Church out to the road and create a number of community rooms and space for groups to come in and use. This increase of groups will hopefully increase the outreach of the Church into the local community.



If you have any questions or might like to book use of one of the community rooms when the building work is completed, this is anticipated to be March 2020 give or take a couple of months.



We have a prayer team and if anyone has a need or something to share, there is the opportunity to chat and pray with someone on the prayer team.

We are planning a trip to Scarborough in the summer. More details when we get it, but we hope that it will include a morning get together at a church in the town followed by an afternoon on the beach. More details in coming weeks.
