A very warm welcome to our 10.30am Holy Communion Service at St Luke's. If it is your first time, we hope that you enjoy worshipping with us. There is coffee, tea and refreshments after the service so please do come and introduce yourself – it would be lovely to chat with you. A few weeks ago we heard the exciting news from Reaching Communities, that we have received sufficient funding, to begin the construction of our new church extension on the West End of the church. This project will take around eight months, there is a lot of hard work ahead of us, but at the end it will give us a wonderful new resource to help us serve our local community. The contract for the building work was signed on Friday and the plan is that the building work will start on Tuesday August 27th and finish in early May next year. That will mean that our last Sunday in this building will be Sunday August 25th.



We are grateful to the team at St Luke's School, who are allowing us to use the main hall (and a few break out rooms) for services on a Sunday morning. Thanks too to Beeston Hill United Free Church, who will be hosting our toddler and ESOL groups whilst we are out of the building. We hope we will be back into the new build around Christmas time.



Great news - In September we will be joined by another member of staff, Jean-Louis Pecher. Jean-Louis married to Ruth lives in Bramley and they have four children (grown up) and two grand children. Jean Louis is a computer expert, and has also worked for several years in mission leading congregations in Belgium and in South Carolina in the USA. Currently attending Christ Church Upper Armley, he will be ordained at 11am on Saturday 29th June at Wakefield Cathedral.

Also on that day Debbie N from our own congregation will be ordained in the afternoon at 3pm. Do pray for them and if you can, come along and join both of them on this special day.



We have a prayer team and if anyone has a need or something to share, there is the opportunity to chat and pray with someone on the prayer team. You can find this by the St Peter's chapel to the left of the stage, after the service.



After church today 16th June, we are having a walk of friendship. Christians from St Luke's, St Mary's and Beeston Hill Free church will join Sikhs from the Gurdwara on Lady Pitt Lane and Muslims from the Abu Huraira Mosque in a walk of friendship between different places of worship in the local area. The event will start at BHUFC at 12 noon and include lunch at the Gudwara and Tea at the mosque. The event is organised by Concord, which works to build friendships across religious communities.
